The DISTRICT #1 fund was established in April 2022 as a volunteer initiative of the gentrification project "Block Party Festival District #1."

By May 2022, the project had evolved into a Charitable Organization and began operating as a Charitable Fund registered in the State Register of Non-Profit Institutions and Organizations of Ukraine (non-profit organization code according to EDRPOU – 44769813).

The primary focus of the fund is Ukraine's reconstruction, livelihood opportunities, and the provision of humanitarian aid to the population.

District #1 operates in almost all regions of Ukraine affected by the devastating impact of the war and has a number of local partners helping to expand the geography of assistance. Our goal is to become an international humanitarian organization with its headquarters in Ukraine and to continue implementing projects in the future that will improve the lives of Ukrainians through changes in the country's infrastructure.



18.04.22 after 2 weeks of Kyiv region deoccupation we gathered 20 volunteers and went to Hostomel to help people



In 6 months we had 1000 people in volunteers' database and started:

- winterization of houses
- light repairs
- dismantling of damaged houses
- address humanitarian aid



In 21 months, we have multiplied the scale of assistance we provide several times. DISTRICT #1 has a clear organizational structure, well-defined help directions, and specified goals for scaling help in the fund's activities.

All of policies and procedures are adopted to the Ukrainian reality from the best european transparency practices and prevention of corruption. As well as practices of building cooperation with other non-profits globally and locally with government structures and beneficiaries.



In 2023 the foundation has joined The Global Shelter Cluster (GSC) – an Inter-Agency Standing Committee (IASC) coordination mechanism that supports people affected by disasters and internally displaced people affected by conflict with the means to live in safe, dignified and appropriate shelter.

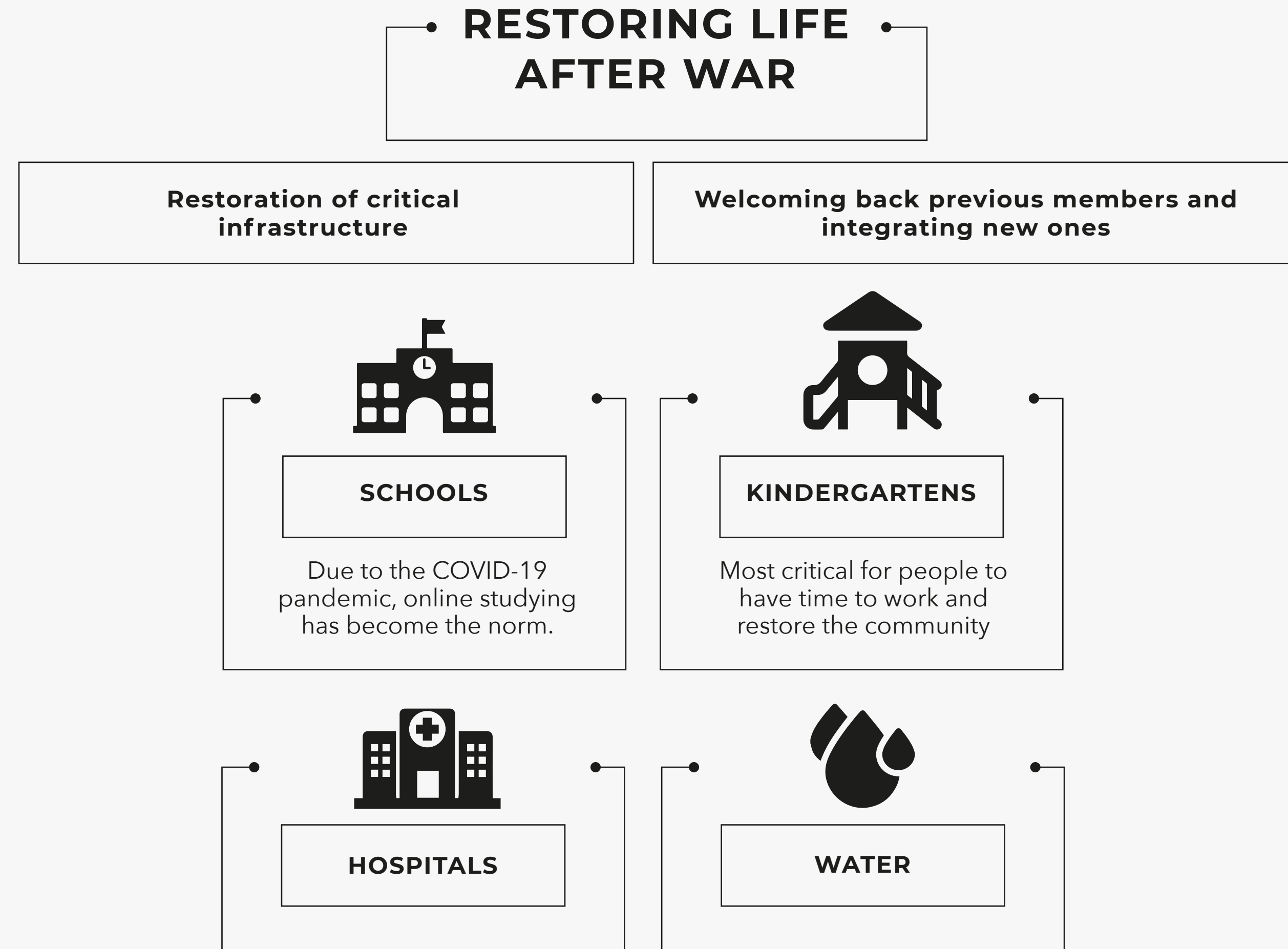
OUR JOB IS NOT WALLS AND ROOFS CONSTRUCTION

The revitalization of de-occupied communities requires a comprehensive approach.

Sustainable communities are not only need new or renovated houses, but functional infrastructure, both technical and social. Infrastructure is vital.

That's never enough to build housing and settle people. That is necessary to provide the community with everything required for further development and help IDPs to integrate and become a part of the community, not temporary premises.

If we can reconstruct the only one infrastructure object it will be a kindergarten to let parents work on their community restoration.

**KAZKA KINDERGARTEN CASE
STUDY**

Kazka kindergarten in Gorenka, Kyiv region, was significantly damaged by two shells that exploded in the building patio, and by the blast wave from them. Before the war, 70 children studied in Kazka, the only state kindergarten in the villages of Gorenka and Moshchun, but after the occupation they all switched to online education.

30% of the roof and the drainage system were completely destroyed, the internal and external walls and ceilings of several rooms were damaged by debris. In addition to the complete replacement of the roof rafter system, with the replacement of the roofing and insulation of the facade for energy efficiency, the kindergarten required renovation of all internal spaces.

Beneficiaries

- residents of the villages of Gorenka and Moschun, whose children can attend kindergarten again

Achieved Outcomes

- 500 m2 of premises, 430 m2 of roof and 750 m2 of facade were renovated

- The Soviet design has been completely replaced by a modern one
- 70 children returned to kindergarten

The District 1 Charitable Foundation, **in cooperation with IsraAID Germany**, has successfully completed the restoration of a kindergarten in the village of Ozera in the Gostomel community, which was damaged by the hostilities. Thanks to our joint efforts, the kindergarten has been transformed from ruins into a restored and safe place for the young residents of the community.

The reconstruction process included the complete dismantling of the old roof and rafter system, after which a new structure was built from scratch. We also cleared the rubble in the part of the kindergarten where the shell hit directly, and rebuilt an entire corner of the building that was destroyed.

We are really glad that we were able to provide such meaningful assistance to the community. The opening of the kindergarten in the village of Ozera is a clear indication of our commitment to rebuilding and providing hope for the people of Gostomel.

KINDERGARTEN IN MOSTYSCHKE VILLAGE

While starting to restore **the Mostyshche branch of Lyceum #1**, the volunteers of the Rayon#1 Charitable Foundation first started dismantling the remains of the old roof and preparing the school building for repair work. This step was necessary to ensure the safety and effectiveness of the restoration process.

As part of the reconstruction project, **the Rayon#1 Charitable Foundation was able to build a completely new roof** for the lyceum. Funding for this important part of the project was provided by the funds raised during the "Block party" event organized by the foundation itself. This event was a key moment in attracting resources and community support.

In addition, **in cooperation with Polish philanthropists from BRDA**, we managed to manufacture and install 26 new windows, thus ensuring not only the restoration of the school's functionality, but also comfort for students and teachers. These steps played a crucial role in the process of restoring the lyceum, returning it to serve as a place of education and development for the youth of the Gostomel community.



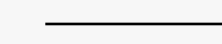
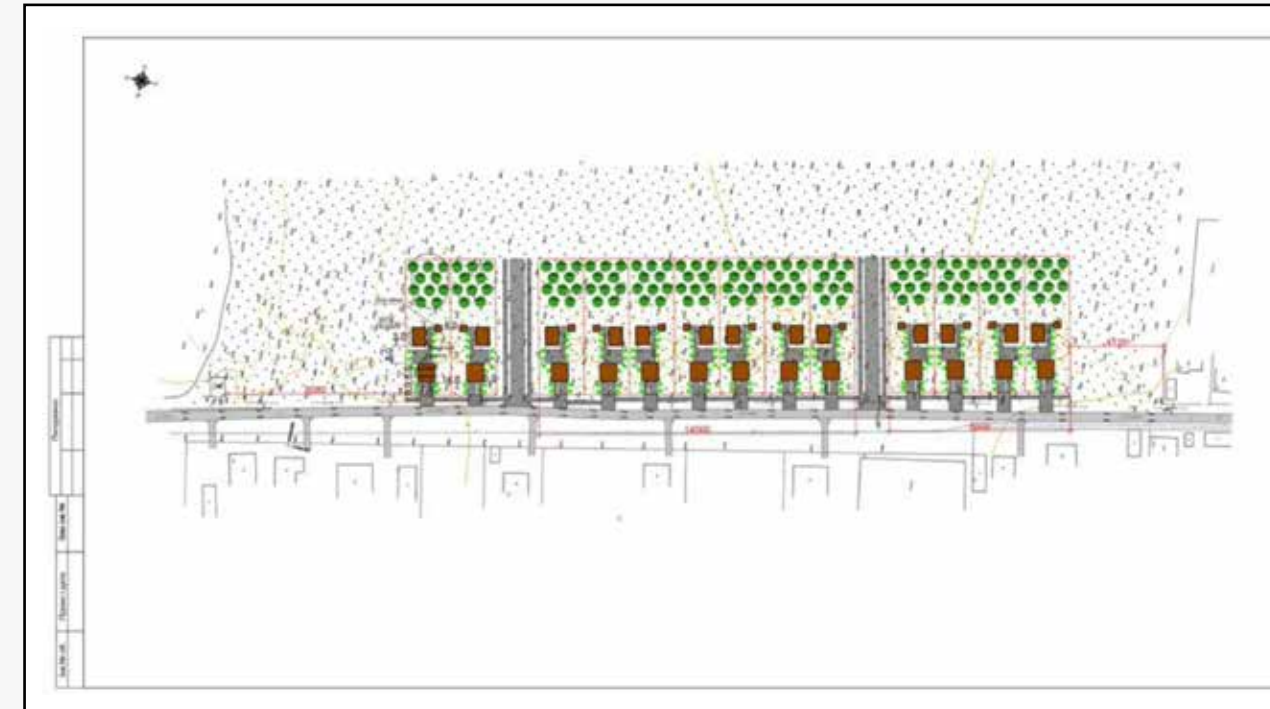
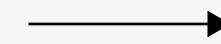
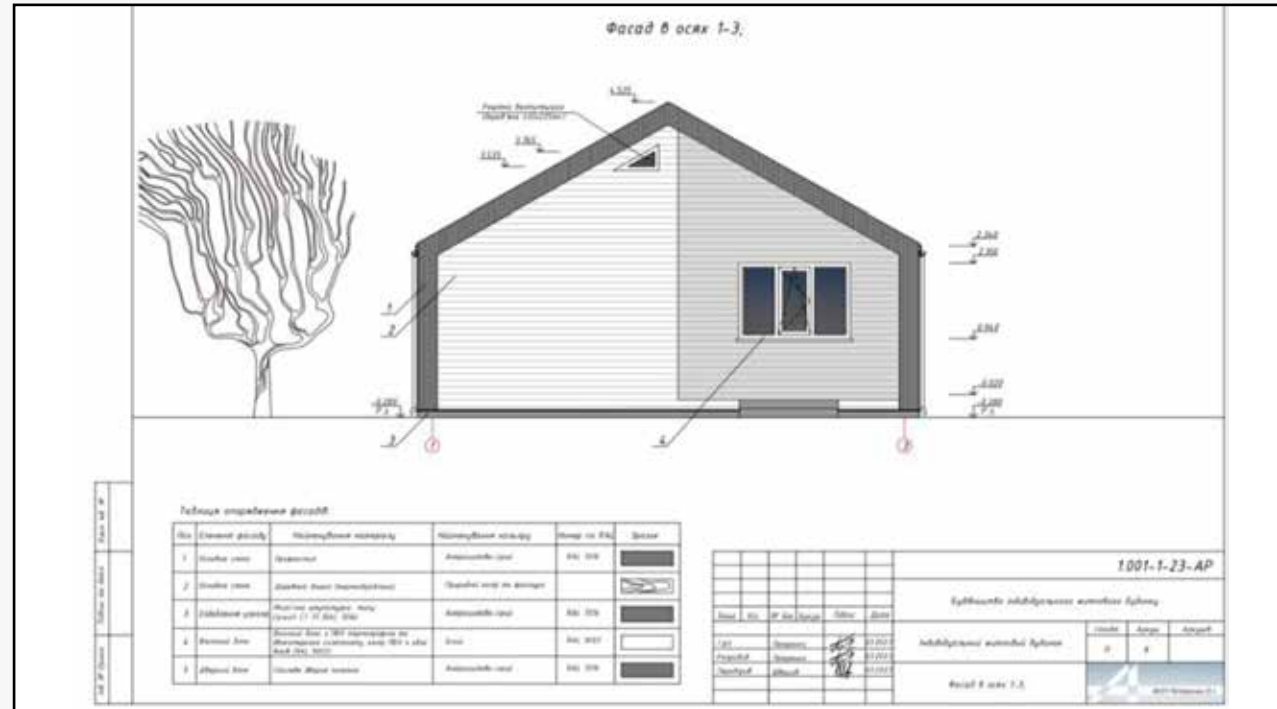

This project is a testament to the commitment of DISTRICT #1 in rebuilding communities.

By addressing the needs of both internally displaced persons (IDPs) and the local community, the initiative is contributing to workforce development and creating entrepreneurial opportunities within the community. Furthermore, it is transforming the community's perception of IDPs, fostering unity and collaboration. As a result of this success, several regional mayors have expressed interest in replicating similar projects and dedicating land for such initiatives.

Extra: for community officials our joint three-partie work on the project ended with the new skill to engage donors actively for sustainable development of their community.

HOUSE FOR MS. SVITLANA

HOUSE FOR MS. SVITLANA

“DISTRICT #1”, in collaboration with **Bacardi Martini**, took on an ambitious task - to build a new home for Ms. Svitlana from Irpin, who lost her dwelling due to conflict. This project became an embodiment of joint efforts and interaction between public organizations and business in solving social problems.

The project encompassed several stages: from designing and planning the house to its construction and furnishing. Special attention was given to creating an energy-efficient and environmentally friendly living space. The use of modern building materials and technologies allowed for the creation of a comfortable and safe living space.

The final stage of the project was furnishing the house with necessary furniture and household appliances, providing Ms. Svitlana and her family with all conditions for comfortable living. Thus, the new home became not only a physical shelter but also a symbol of hope and new opportunities for the family that experienced loss.

FINANCIAL TRANSPARENCY

The Charitable Foundation "DISTRICT #1" is a non-profit organization DISTRICT #1 operates as a fully transparent structure, adhering to the principle of maximally effective use of funds with minimal administrative

We utilize no more than 10% of the received funds for the foundation's operational activities, while 90% are directed towards helping those in need. We have implemented transparent and strict procurement policies, allowing us to select the most effective contractors and vendors at reasonable costs for our projects.

We regularly and systematically report to our partners about the targeted and transparent use of funds according to their standards. We also offer our own reporting system developed by District #1 if the partner's policies don't dictate specific requirements.

Budget Optimization in Construction Formulating budgets in construction projects is complex, often inaccurate, and always expensive, with a significant portion of the funds typically consumed by intermediary companies. Understanding this, District #1 has created and continually develops an in-house team functioning as a development structure. This enables us to work directly with contractors who perform the actual work on the construction site. In terms of reconstruction, our fund essentially acts as a non-profit development organization staffed with architects, engineers, and specialists in managing construction projects.

IMPACT-BASED APPROACH

Comparing the impact of different humanitarian activities is always challenging due to the diverse nature of their outcomes and the difficulty in quantifying certain social or humanitarian benefits.

In the context of assisting people affected by war damage, we can't compare but measure and prioritize.

To secure the high efficiency in funds utilization and proper beneficiaries targeting, we:

- Assess needs twice
 1. A preliminary remote assessment based on scanned documents and information from officials in a more generalized manner is needed to estimate the needs and their volume in the number of people in need, households, damage level, etc.
 2. in-person documents review and needs assessment by our team in an early project stage
- Use a combination of quantitative and qualitative metrics
- Define measurable goals in the overlap of needs and the fund's possibilities
- Consider the specific context and local needs of the community
- Monitor each activity
- Evaluate the cost-effectiveness of each activity
- Establish robust data collection and monitoring mechanisms to track the progress and impact of each activity over time.

Among the DISTRICT #1 team, we don't say "donors" when we mention them internally. We say "partners". Funding is crucial for the foundation's activities, but working with donors is a dynamic partnership beyond financial contribution for us.

Productive partnerships are at the core of the work carried out by DISTRICT #1. We collaborate with international and local NGOs and state bodies at all levels - from the State Agency for Reconstruction and Development of Infrastructure of Ukraine to city mayors and representatives of territorial communities - to ensure high-quality implementation of projects. International partners provide us with access to resources and expertise, which, in turn, helps us to implement innovative solutions. Collaborating with local NGOs helps us interact better with local communities and consider their needs when planning and executing projects. Our partnership with state bodies at all levels allows us to effectively address housing and social issues and promote sustainable development by jointly addressing social challenges.

We remember that other local NGOs are not competitors but partners, too. The higher the competition in our sector, the faster humanitarian work becomes unnecessary.

COOPERATION WITH GOVERNMENT

In 2023, DISTRICT #1 cooperated with the State Restoration Agency of Ukraine in a settlement reconstruction project in Posad-Pokrovske, Kherson region.

The concept of restoration of Posad-Pokrovske envisages complex reconstruction: the construction of residential and farm buildings, the construction of a school and a kindergarten, and the last will be a village council house.

Within the current frame, DISTRICT #1 builds private houses on the beneficiary's plot using the Agency's project.

The first 5 houses are already roofed by the end of 2023. For 2024, we already scheduled 25 more houses to build in the village within the same project.

REFERENCE.

Posad-Pokrovske is a village on the border of Kherson and Mykolaiv regions. The village was under the occupation by russians in February-March 2022, after, it was on the front line. Until November 2022, russians shelled Posad-Pokrovske daily. 100% of of municipal and private property in the village were damaged. Before the war broke off, there were 2,240 of residents, and only 20 during the war. In 2023 many people returned to the village.



COOPERATION WITH LOCAL NGOs

Local partners are our eyes, ears, feet, and hands for scouting and needs assessment.

Furthermore, local NGO partners help us to extend assistance coverage to the most complex, remote, and risky areas. They help us to deliver stoves and food parcels to the most remote villages under the daily shelling and without a road to them.

They never travel empty. In the frontline villages they collect people stories and assess their needs.



CHALLENGES AND SOLUTIONS

CHALLENGES 2023

- Incompatibility of reporting and legal requirements from Ukrainian regulation and donor's country regulation
- Lack of construction workers
- Delays in approvals on donors' side
- Low level of education and qualification, and inertia of municipal officials

SOLUTIONS IN 2024

- We already set up the reporting system to match non matching and need to keep it updated with all the requirements appear in the future
- Run educational projects for construction workers
- Include potential delay periods in the projects' design.
- Create a set of simple questionnaires to collect data and step-by-step explainers on how we cooperate.

BENEFICIARIES OF FUND'S PROJECTS

MS. OKSANA'S FAMILY

Ms. Oksana's family is one of thirteen local households for whom we built new homes, replacing those destroyed due to military aggression. The house of Ms. Oksana's family symbolizes the revival of life in places where it was shattered.

This family is incredibly warm and hospitable, **having received much-needed new housing**. Our meetings with them are filled with warmth and inspire us to do even more to help others.

Ms. Oksana's hospitality is particularly striking. She always greets us with a large amount of deliciously prepared food, demonstrating her gratitude and big heart. It truly reminds us that our efforts are making a significant positive impact on lives.



MR. OLEKSANDR

Mr. Oleksandr, a resident of Posad-Pokrovske village in Kherson region, faced tragedy when his village was completely destroyed, being directly on the frontline of military conflict. Life in the village halted, and its buildings and infrastructure suffered extensive damage.

However, with **the change in circumstances following** the de-occupation of the right bank of Kherson region, the frontline receded, and residents began returning to Posad-Pokrovske. It was a time of revival for the village and its community.

As part of a state program for reconstruction, our organization received a request from the government to assist in the village's renewal. We embarked on the construction of 25 new houses to provide the villagers with new homes and hope for a better future.

Special attention is given to Mr. Oleksandr, who has a disability. Understanding his unique needs, we are developing a special house project, which will be as convenient and accessible for him as possible. This house will not just be a dwelling, but a place where Oleksandr can feel comfortable and safe.



MS. SVITLANA

We first met Ms. Svitlana in April 2022, immediately after the de-occupation of the Kyiv region. Her house was completely destroyed due to the conflict, but a summer kitchen partially survived.

Our volunteers promptly worked to adapt this summer kitchen into a livable space, providing Ms. Svitlana with temporary accommodation.

Throughout this time, **we kept thinking** about Ms. Svitlana and looked for ways to help her.

Then, **in the summer of 2023**, with the support of our partners at Bacardi Martini, we undertook a project to build a new house for Ms. Svitlana and her family. This became an important step not only in providing them with new housing but also in restoring hope and confidence in the future.



PEOPLE IN THE WAR ZONE

People in the de-occupied and frontline areas of Kherson and Zaporizhzhia oblasts **face a serious lack of resources, logistical challenges and a difficult economic situation**, which make it difficult for them to meet their basic food needs. Our goal is to help reduce the financial pressure on families living in these difficult conditions and support them in meeting their basic needs.

Through active communication with the residents of the affected regions, our team at District #1 has developed a special food package that covers the monthly dietary needs of families of 2-4 people.

The entire process, **from receiving donor funds to distributing the food parcels to people**, takes 7 to 14 days.

As of January 2024, our team has prepared and delivered 2,500+ food parcels to 3,461 people. We continue to help vulnerable people with food parcels with the support of our financial partner IsraAID Germany.

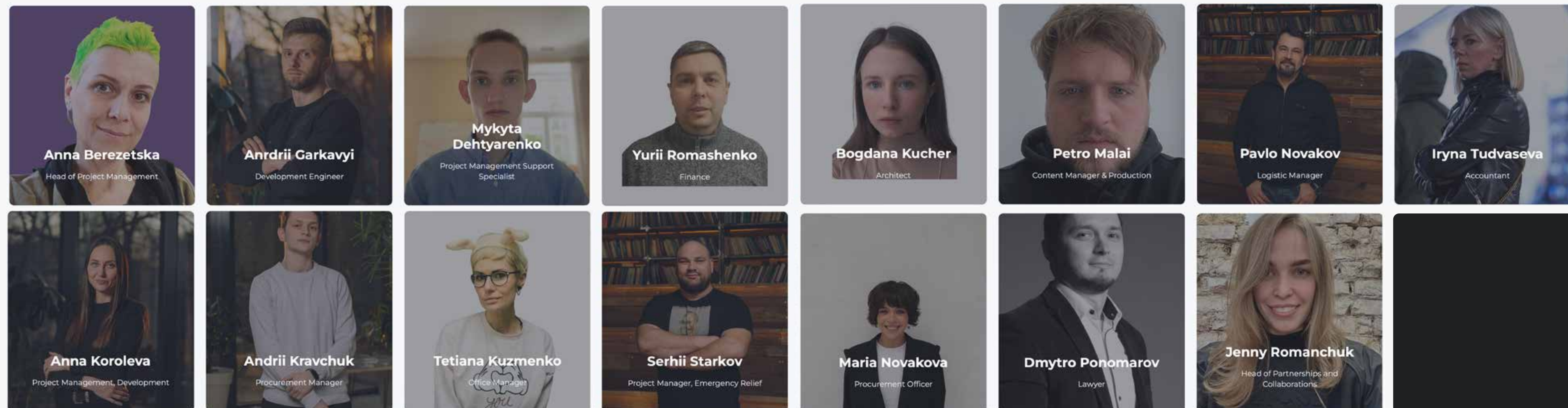
DISTRICT #1 - TEAM

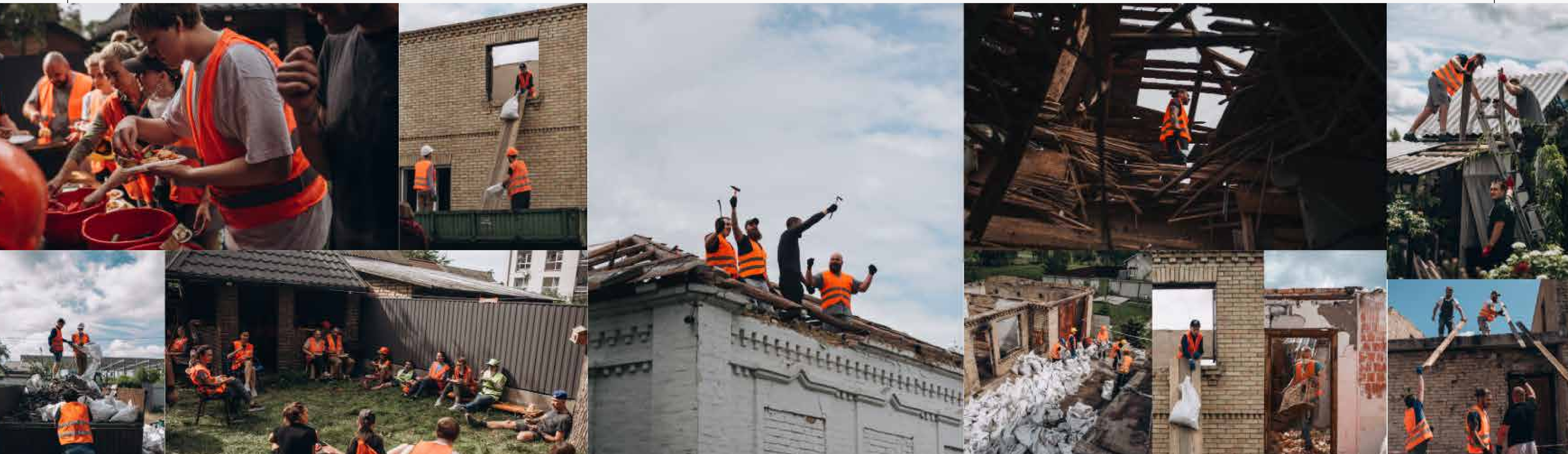
However, within less than two years, the core team is still a part of the foundation and has developed far from newbies in the spring of 2022.
